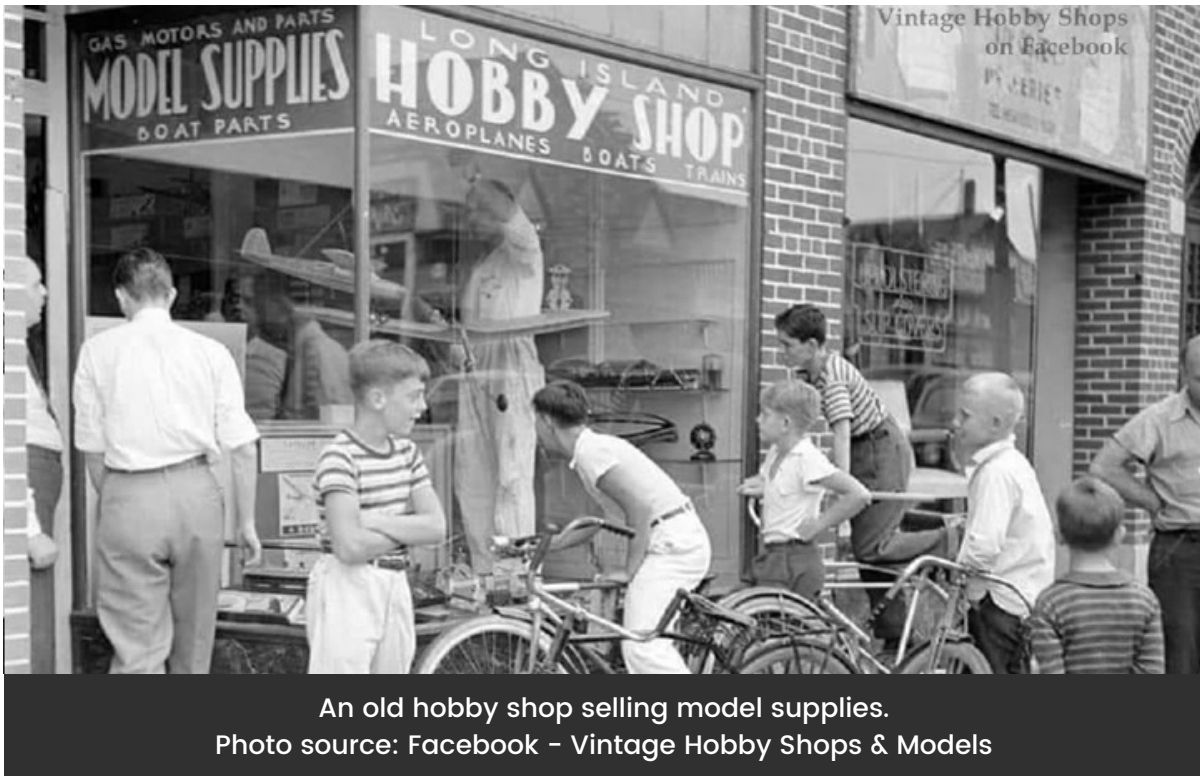


Keeping Brain Fit At Home
